

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Nelson, Moores, Johns, Ely, and Orlick,

Mr. Scott, presented a petition of the commissioners of Cecil county, praying the passage of an act authorising them to levy such sums of money as may be necessary to pay the balance due for the erection of the public offices in said county,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Scott, Harlan, and Nowland.

Mr. Jones of Balt. presented a petition of Gassaway Walkins of the city of Baltimore, praying for a special act of insolvency,

Which was read and referred to the committee on Insolvency.

Mr. Brengle presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for the abolition of the Lottery System;

Which was read and referred to the committee on lotteries.

Mr. Brengle also presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying the passage of an act authorising and empowering justices of the peace, to take cognizance in all cases of debt where the claim does not exceed the sum of fifty dollars;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Also, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, representing that the laws regulating the inspection of Lime in Baltimore, operate unjustly upon them, &c.;

Which was read and referred to the committee on inspections.

Mr. Harding presented a petition of the trustees of the Rockville Academy, remonstrating against a division of the donation from the State of Maryland to said Academy;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Hood presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Baltimore and Anne Arundel counties, praying that the inspection law, regulating Lime sent to the city of Baltimore, may be so altered as to cause the same to be sold by weight; Which was read and referred to the committee on inspections.

And, Mr. Hughes presented a petition of John B. Lawson, collector of Charles county, praying to be refunded certain money paid by him into the treasury;
