

The bill reported by Mr. Devemon, entitled, an act to repeal the fourth section of an act, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, was taken up for consideration;

The said bill was then read the second time;

And the question put, shall the said bill pass?

Determined in the negative.

So the bill was rejected.

The bill reported by Mr. Hearn, entitled, an act to authorise the Levy Courts of Somerset and Worcester counties to purchase a ferry boat for the use of Steven's or Polli's ferry, between Somerset and Worcester counties, and to regulate the letting out of said ferry;

And, the bill reported by Mr. Kershner, entitled, an act to confirm the proceedings of the commissioners in locating and bounding the eighth election district in Washington county;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Sutton, chairman of the committee on pensions by county assessment, entitled, an act relating to county pensioners, was taken up for consideration, when

On motion of Mr. Johns, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The house then adjourned until Monday morning, ten o'clock.

MONDAY, January 26th, 1835.

The house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Teackle presented a petition of Robert C. Russum, William Arvey, Joseph Venables, and others, of Somerset county, praying that the powers confided to the levy court, may be exercised by persons elected immediately by the people;

Which was read and referred to Messrs Teackle, Coltman, and Jones of Somerset.

Mr. Beall presented a petition of sundry inhabitants of Allegany county, praying the passage of an act, to authorise the appointment of commissioners for the purpose of raising by subscription, money for the building of a market house in the town of Cumberland, in said county.
