Mr. Harlan presented a petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying that the Nottingham Library Company, in said county, may be furnished with copies of the acts of assembly, &c.

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

And, Mr. Brengle presented a petition of N. H. Pitt, praying the passage of an act to regulate the manner in which Church property shall be held;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Johns obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to appoint Mary Jordan, of Harford county, trustee for the sale of certain lands therein mentioned;

Ordered, That Messrs. Johns, Sutton, and Moores, report the same.

Mr. Devecmon obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the "Savage Coal and Iron Company," in Allegany county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Devecmon, Bruce, and McMahon, report the same.

Mr. Jones of Somerset, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, delivered the following report—which was read the first and second time by special order, and concurred in.

Mr. Carpenter submitted the following resolutions, Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Orphans Court of Charles county be, and they are hereby authorised and required to draw upon the Treasurer of the Western Shore, in favor of the Trustees St. Paul's Chapel Free School of Charles county, for two hundred dollars of the free school fund for said county, for the year 1834.

Resolved, That the Orphans' Court of Charles county be authorised to draw upon the Treasurer of the Western Shore for, and pay over annually to the Trustees of St. Paul's Chapel Free School in Charles county, two hundred dollars, out of that portion of the avails of the Free School fund heretofore directed to be invested annually for the benefit of Charles county—provided, said Orphans' Court shall be satisfied that twenty five poor children of said county have the privilege of being instructed annually in said school.

Which were read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and sent to the senate.
