Which was read and referred to Messrs. Welty, Kershner, and Wharton.

Mr. Ricard presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Kent county, on the evils resulting from the present license law of this State, and praying an amendment thereto;

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

And, Mr. Teackle presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore and Anne Arundel counties, praying for an act to incorporate a company under the name and style of the Middle Branch Floating Bridge Company; Which was read and referred to Messrs. Teackle, Ely, and Iglehart.
