And, delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the relief of the securities of the collectors of taxes and of sheriffs, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 282.

Also, a bill, entitled, an act to make valid a certain deed from Bene S. Pigman to Henry Motter, bearing date 12th day of June 1824, and recorded in Liber J. C. No 20. folio 226 &c. one of the land records of Frederick county;

And, A bill, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an Act for quieting possessions, entolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers,

Which were severally read, and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice,
