

15th instant, the whole amount of money received as donations from the State, since the passage of the resolution of December session, 1831, No. 29, and the manner in which said monies have been expended, distinguishing particularly the amount paid to the teacher or teachers, with their names, from the amount applied towards the extinguishment of the debts due on account of the corporation, and also to state particularly and specifically, the amount paid for the completion of the building; and also the amount applied in purchasing furniture and implements for said Academy;

Which was read,

Mr. Nelson moved to lay said order on the table; Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred, and was put on the adoption of said order;

Resolved in the affirmative

The house then adjourned until tomorrow morning at ten o'clock.

THURSDAY, February 5th, 1835.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Jones of Somerset, presented a memorial of John Wrotten and others, of Somerset county, praying the passage of an act to make valid certain proceedings therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Jones of Somerset, also presented a memorial of the widow and heirs at law of the late Dr. Matthias Jones, of Somerset county, relative to the petition of William Dorsey, for a law to authorise him to make a road;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Jones of Somerset, Dashiell, and Teackle.

Mr. Teackle presented a petition of Polly Stevens, widow of the late Levi Stevens, of Somerset county, praying for a pension, in consideration of the services of her said husband in the war of the revolution;

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Hambleton of Talbot, presented a petition of the Grand jurors of Talbot county, praying that the law of 1826, chapter 196, entitled, an act relating to the public roads in said county, may be revived;
