

Which amendment was read, and ordered to lie on the table;

And delivered the following message:

By the Senate;

February 6th, 1835:

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We have received your message, requesting us to recon-

sider and recede from the amendment to the bill, entitled,

an act to allow further time to Matthias Dashiell, late sheriff

and collector of Somerset county, to complete his collec-

tions; and in compliance with the request, have reconsidered

the same, and take leave respectfully to point out to your

honorable body, the proviso to an act of 1831, ch. 141, as

a precedent in point to fortify the amendment in question.

It is however deemed proper, in the absence of any such

example, that the limitations which attach under the existing

provisions on this subject, should not by any special legis-

lation made to affect third parties who may be ignorant

of facts and have not the facility of ascertaining the exist-

ence of liens upon land, as is the case with judgments.

Under this view of the question, with reasons that we

appreciate, sustained by precedent, we have thought fit re-

spectfully to decline to recede from the amendment.
