Which was read,

The said resolution was then read the second time by special order, and assented to.

Mr. Hood, chairman of the committee on the militia, also made a favorable report upon the resolution submitted by Mr. Gale, on the 30th ultimo, requiring the Armourer at Annapolis, to deliver to Captain William Camp, of Kent county, a number of swords and pistols, not exceeding sixty of each, with appropriate accoutrements, &c.

Which was read;

The said resolution was then read the second time, and assented to.

Mr. Brengle obtained leave to bring in a bill, for the relief of Otho Savoy, now confined in the jail of Frederick county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Brengle, Annan, and Duvall, report the same.

Mr. Jones, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province, and limiting the extent of them;

Also, the bill, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estate of purchasers, severally reported the same without amendment.

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, delivered the following report:

The committee on grievances and courts of justice, to whom was referred the petition of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, praying the passage of a law, giving to the several Orphans' Courts of this state, jurisdiction over surviving partners, in the same manner they now have over the legal representatives of deceased executors, administrators, and guardians, have had the subject under consideration, and report, that they deem it inexpedient to grant the prayer of the petitioners, and ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the subject.
