And, the bill, entitled, an act to appoint Mary Jordan, of Harford county, trustee for the sale of certain land therein mentioned;

Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Jones of Somerset, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made an unfavorable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Merrick, entitled, an act to alter the mode of compensating clerks of the county courts, and registers of wills, in the several counties of this State;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The doorkeeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the motion submitted by Mr. Pratt, to expunge from the journal of the house the preamble and resolutions submitted by Mr. Dorsey in relation to the nomination of Roger B. Taney, esq. before the Senate of the United States;
