The bill from the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act for the relief of the securities of the collectors of taxes and of sheriffs, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 232;

Also, the bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province, and limiting the extent of them; Were returned to the senate.
