Mr. Turner, of Calvert, obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act for the revaluation and reassessment of the real and personal property in Calvert county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Turner, of Calvert, Beckett and Laville, report the same.

On motion of Mr. Ridgely,

Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, be required to inquire into the propriety of allowing to Eleanor Dent, a pension for services rendered by her husband, John Dent, during the revolutionary war.

Mr. Wells submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That David Ridgely, the State Librarian, be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to receive and receipt for the Congressional Documents due to the State by the act of Congress, passed at the 1st session of the 22d Congress; and approved July 10th, 1832, together with any other public documents heretofore presented by acts of Congress, and not received.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Ridgely submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay unto the Commissioners of the Tax, for Anne Arundel county, the sum of dollars, to be by them applied to defraying the expences of arrest, prosecution, and conviction of the rioters on the Baltimore and Washington Railroad.

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Wyse, from the select committee, delivered the following report.

The select committee to whom was referred the petition of James Boyle, ask leave to be discharged from the further consideration of it, and that the same be referred to the committee on claims.
