

On motion of Mr. Moores, said article was further amended, by inserting in lieu of the words so stricken out, these words, 'or of the city of Baltimore;'

Mr. Wyse moved to amend the 18th article of said bill, by striking out these words; 'or of any particular state, to an amount exceeding fifty thousand dollars, or to any foreign Prince or State whatever;'

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Pratt, said article was further amended by inserting after the word 'State,' in the third line thereof, the words 'any sum;'

Mr. Ely moved further to amend said article, by striking out from the word 'State,' in the second line, to the word 'State,' inclusive, in the third line thereof;

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Jones, of Baltimore, said 18th article was amended by striking out these words; 'or of any particular state;'

On motion of Mr. Jones, of Baltimore, said article was further amended, by inserting after the word 'any,' in the third line thereof, these words; 'other State of this Union; or any.'

Mr. Wyse moved to amend said bill, by striking out in the 19th article, first line, the words 'the several,' and inserting in lieu thereof, the words 'all the;'

On the question being put on striking out, it was Determined in the negative.

Mr. Jones, of Baltimore, then moved to strike out the same words, and insert in lieu thereof, these words, 'two or more;'

Determined in the negative.
