Mr. Ely, presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying the passage of an act to regulate the Baltimore markets;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Ely, McLean, Ridgely, Annan, Sutton, Bayly, and Dennis.

Mr. Teackle, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Somerset county, praying for an act to authorise the construction of a Rail Road;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Teackle, Long, Dennis, Spence, and Whitelock.

Mr. McLean, presented a petition of Michael Toner, and others, of the city of Baltimore, praying to condemn and make public an alley, called West alley, in said city;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. McLean, Richardson, and Ely.

And, Mr. Richardson presented a petition of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act to incorporate the Columbian Beneficial Society of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to Messrs, Richardson, McLean, and Carroll, of Baltimore county.
