and reported that on counting the joint ballot of both houses, they had found that there were altogether eighty seven votes taken, of which number George Combs received sixty eight votes, and that there were nineteen blank ballots.

Whereupon it was declared and resolved in the House of Delegates, that George Combs he, and he is hereby recommended to his Excellency, the Governor of Maryland, to be commissioned as Register of Wills for Saint Mary's county.

The House then adjourned until to morrow morning, 10 o'clock.

THURSDAY, December 31st. 1835.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The Speaker laid before the House, reports from the commissioners of the tax for Prince George's, Worcester, and Frederick counties, containing a summary list of all the Real and Personal property in said counties,

Which were severally read and referred to the committee

on Ways and Means,

Also, A communication from the cierk of the House, containing a list of the Bills, Resolutions, and Reports, which originated in the House of Delegates, and were referred from the session of 1834, to the succeeding session,

Which was read and ordered to lie on the table,

Also, a report from the Sheriff of Worcester county, relative to the several sums of money paid by them into the public treasury within the year ending on the 30th of November,

Which were severally read and referred to the committee

on Ways and Means.

The Speaker also laid before the House reports from the clerks of Montgomery, Allegany, Washington, Queen Anne's, Talbot, Worcester, and Caroline counties, relative to the attendance of the judges,

Which were severally read and referred to the committee

on Grievances and courts of Justice,

The Speaker also laid before the House a report from the President and board of trustees of the Allegany Academy,
