

Mr. Larrimore, presented a petition of Lydia Roberts, of the state of Delaware, praying a pension for services rendered by her husband in the war of the revolution.

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Brown, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore and Harford counties, praying for the passage of an act to regulate the Baltimore markets.

Which was read and referred to the select committee already appointed on that subject.

And, Mr. Boyd, presented a memorial of Zephaniah Bayles of Harford county, praying the passage of an act authorising the county court of said county, to confirm the proceedings of certain commissioners therein mentioned.

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Winder, who had leave of absence, again appeared in the house and resumed his seat.

Mr. Winder, presented a petition of Henry Eberhart, of the state of Virginia, praying a special act of insolvency.

Which was read and referred to the committee on insolvency.

Also presented a memorial of the trustees of the Govans-town Academy, in Baltimore county, praying that the Academy and the improvements thereon, may be exempt from taxation.

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

Ordered, That the several petitions from sundry citizens of Somerset county, presented at the last session, praying that persons may be elected immediately by the people, clothed with the powers now exercised by the Levy court of said county, be withdrawn from the files of this house, and referred to the committee appointed on the same subject this session.

On motion of Mr. Carpenter,

Ordered, That the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment, enquire into the propriety of placing Jane S. Posey, on the pension roll of Charles county.

Mr. Dulany, submitted the following order,

Ordered, That a committee of three, be appointed by the Speaker, whose duty it shall be to visit the Penitentiary in Baltimore, to examine into its condition, and that they be instructed to report to this house by bill or otherwise.
