By the House of Delegates,

January 5th, 1835.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised to pay to the several Members of the General Assembly, and the Officers thereof, or to their respective orders, the several sums of money now due, or that from time to time may become due to them respectively, and for which they shall obtain certificates from the committee on Claims of the present House of Delegates;

Which was read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

REPORT:

By the House of Delegates,

January 5th 1836.

Whereas a great number of persons, inhabitants of Somerset and Worcester counties, by their memorial in writing, have represented to the General Assembly, that they are laboring under great inconveniences from the want of a navigation being opened between the said counties, from the head of the "Dividing Creek" to the Pocomoke River, for the transportation of grain, timber, and other productions of the soil and forest, the distance being about twelve miles;
