So the house agreed to reconsider their vote.

On motion of Mr. Ridgely, said bill was then laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Long, the house took up for consideration the bill, reported by Mr. Dulany, chairman of the committee on insolvency, entitled, an act for the relief of William Anderson, of Somerset county.

Mr. Long then offered as a substitute for said bill, the tollowing:

An act for the benefit of William Anderson of Somerset County.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, that William Anderson of Somerset county, and State of Maryland, be and he is hereby entitled to the benefit of the insolvent law of Maryland, without the requisitions of two years residence in said State, as prescribed by said law, provided said William Anderson shall in all other respects comply with said requisitions—and provided also, that the said William Anderson shall be compelled to file his petition for the benefit of said acts, before the appropriate tribunal, in Somerset county, before his discharge.

Which was read;

Mr. Richardson moved to lay said bill and substitute on the table.

Resolved in the affirmative. On motion of Mr. Brewer,

Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, be instructed to enquire into the propriety of granting to Mrs. Sarah Easton, of the District of Columbia, a pension, in consideration of the services of her late husband, Captain Jordan, during the revolution.

On motion of Mr. Wharton, the house adjourned until tomorrow morning ten o'clock.
