

Duvall, entitled, an act for the benefit of Thomas H. Clagett and Charles Gassaway, citizens of Loudon county, in the State of Virginia, reported the same with the following amendment,

Amendment proposed:

Insect in the eighth line, after the word "fit," these words, "solely for the cultivation and improvement of said farms,"

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Berry, submitted the following order,

Ordered, that the Armourer be directed to hoist the flag on the steeple of the State House, to-morrow the 8th of January, in commemoration of the glorious anniversary of the battle of Orleans;

Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Townsend, said order was amended by inserting after the word "January," these words, "from sun rise to sun set,"

Mr. Duckett moved further to amend said order, by adding at the end thereof the following:

"And that the Armourer be also ordered to hoist the flag on the 7th of November next, in honor of the memorable battle of Tippecanoe;"

Which was read.

Mr. Heard moved to amend said amendment, by adding at the end thereof, the following:

"And that the flag be hoisted in the same manner, on the day on which the battle of the Thames was fought on our North Western frontier during the late war, in honor of that victory;"

Which was read.

Mr. Pratt, moved that said order and amendments proposed, be indefinitely postponed;

Resolved in the affirmative.
