On motion of Mr. Long, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Dulany (chairman of the committee on insolvency) entitled, an act for the relief of Wm. Anderson of Somerset county, and the substitute offered by him for said bill, entitled, an act for the benefit of William Anderson of Somerset county.

On motion of Mr. Long, said substitute was amended by striking out in the seventh line thereof, the words, "said regulations," and inserting in lieu thereof, the words, "the insolvent laws of Maryland."

On motion of Mr. Long, said substitute was farther amended by adding at the end thereof, the following;

"And shall satisfy said tribunal that he did not come into this State with the view of obtaining the benefit of the insolvent laws."

Mr. McLean moved to postpone said bill and substitute until Monday next.

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put on the adoption of the substitute.

Resolved in the affirmative.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed, and sent to the senate.
