Mr. Bayly who had leave of absence, again appeared in the house and resumed his seat.

The doorkeeper having returned, reported, that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members, that there attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the bill, reported by Mr. Ridgely, entitled, an act for the encouragement of Female Education, in the state of Maryland.

Mr. Brookhart, moved to amend said bill, by adding at the end thereof, as an additional section, the following,

“And be it enacted, that after the aforesaid trustees, shall have received the aforesaid fifteen thousand dollars, and have put the institution in operation, they shall not ask, charge or receive, for tuition, boarding, and all necessary attention, more than one hundred and fifty dollars, except for clothing, per annum, or at the rate thereof, for the higher or highest branches, taught therein, and for other branches in due proportion thereto.”

Which was read.

Mr. Brown, moved to amend said amendment, by striking out these words, “higher or highest branches taught therein, and for other branches in due proportion thereto,”
