The bill reported by Mr. Carpenter, chairman of the committee on divorces, entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Satterfield, of Caroline county from her husband James Satterfield, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and the bill placed in the hands of the chair.

Mr. Burchenal moved to withdraw said bill from the hands

of the chair.

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Burchenal, said bill was then laid on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Duvall, entitled, an act to authorise Abraham Deaver, of Frederick county, to remove and bring into this State, from the county of Loudon, in the State of Virginia, a negro woman, was taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. Duvall, said bill was amended, by striking out in the first section from the word "Missouri," sixth line, to the end of said bill, and inserting in lieu thereof, the following proviso;

"Provided, said Deaver shall comply with the provisions of the fourth section of an act of Assembly, passed at De-

cember session 1831, chapter 323."

The said bill was then read the second time as amended,

and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Sutton, entitled, an act to confirm certain acts of Isaiah Taylor, acting as a justice of the peace in and for Hartord county.

The bill reported by Mr. McCullough, entitled, a supplement to an act for building a bridge over the Little North East in Cecil county, near M. McCauley's mill, passed at December session 1533, chapter 61—And,

The bill reported by Mr. Carpenter, chairman of the committee on divorces, entitled, an act to divorce Jacob Easterday of Washington county, from his wife Fanny Easterday.

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second

time and passed.

The House proceeded to consider the bill reported by Mr. Richardson, entitled, an act to confirm an act passed December session 1834, chapter 219,

On motion of Mr. Ely, the House was called, and the

doorkeeper sent for the absent members,

On motion of Mr. Burchenal, the House resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the doorkeeper,
