Which was read and referred to the committee on griev-

ances and courts of justice.

Mr. Primrose obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to prohibit the issuing of licenses to free negroes in Kent county,

Ordered, that Messrs. Primrose, Miller, and Lassell, re-

port the same.

Mr. Beam obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to provide for the payment of jurors in Montgomery county,

Ordered, that Messrs. Beam, Gittings and Trundle, report

the same.

Mr. Darby obtained leave to bring-in a bill, to be entitled, an act, to limit the setting of the commissioners of the tax in Montgomery county,

Ordered, that Messrs. Darby, Trundle and Beam report

the same.

On motion of Mr. Heard,

Ordered, that the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, he requested to enquire into the expediency of granting a pension to the widow of Jesse Power, a revolutionary soldier, in consideration of the services of her deceased husband.

On motion of Mr. Teackle,

Ordered, that the memorial and petition of Ann Maria Smyth, widow of Major Thomas Smyth, praying an allowance in addition to her present pension, with the accompanying documents in support of her claims be withdrawn from the files of this house, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Brewer submitted the following resolution.
