Which was read and referred to the committee on

insolvency.

And, Mr. Ridgely presented a petition of sundry citizens of Anne Arundel county, praying the passage of an act, to increase the fees of Constables in said county, and for other purposes,

Which was read and referred to the committee on griev-

ances and courts of justice.

The speaker laid before the house, a report of the trustees of Lower Marlborough Academy, relative to the condition of said Academy,

Which was read and referred to the committee on educa-

tion.

Mr. Matthews asked the following leave;

Leave to bring in a bill to authorise the clerks of the several county courts, in this State, to take confessions of Judgment out of court in certain-cases,

Which was read and referred to the committee on griev-

ances and courts of justice.
