Mr. McMahan, chairman of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, submitted the following resolutions,

By the House of Delegates,  
January 14th, 1836.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Sarah Easton, who was the widow of Captain John Jordon, in quarterly payments during, life a sum of money equal to the half pay of a Captain, in consideration of the services rendered by her said husband during the revolutionary war.

By the House of Delegates,  
January 14th, 1836.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Mary Holland out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, in quarterly payments during life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a drummer, in consideration of the services of her husband Edward Holland, during the revolutionary war.

Which were severally read the first and second time by special order, and severally assented to.

Mr. Richardson reported a bill, entitled, an act for the establishment and regulation of the Baltimore city Guards,

Which was read the first time,

And, on motion of Mr. Ridgely referred to the committee on the militia.

The bill reported by Mr. Ely, entitled, an act to establish Magistrates, Courts, in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Burchenal, said bill was laid on the table, and made the order of the day for Thursday next the 21st inst.

The bill reported by Mr. Primrose, entitled, an act to prohibit the issuing of licenses to free negroes and mulattoes in Kent county, was taken up for consideration;

Mr. Palmer moved to strike out the preamble to the bill;
