

FRIDAY, January, 15th 1836.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Allen Elder, of the city of Baltimore,

And the resolutions in favor of Sarah Easton, and Mary Holland, were sent to the senate.

The speaker laid before the house, a report from the trustees of Centreville Academy, in Queen Anne's county, relative to the condition of said academy,

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Wharton presented a petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of an act to ratify and confirm the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania, entitled, an act to incorporate the Franklin rail road company,

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvements.

Mr. McLean presented a memorial of Mrs. Julia Ann Becker, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband John H. Becker,

Which was read, and referred to the committee on Divorces.

Mr. Brewer presented a petition of Rebecca Robinson, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a pension in consideration of the services of her husband Charles Robinson, a lieutenant during the late war of the revolution,

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Ridgely presented a memorial of Horace Capron, Theodore Jenkins, and others, praying an act to incorporate "the Patuxent company," to manufacture Cotton, Iron, and other articles,

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Duvall presented a petition of the aged and infirm citizens of Frederick Town, in Frederick county, praying to be exempt from serving as firemen in said town.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Duvall, Annan, and Shriver.
