On motion of Mr. Brewer,

Ordered, that the petition of Robert N. Copper, a soldier of the revolution, presented to the last General Assembly of Maryland, with the accompanying documents, be withdrawn from the files of the house, and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

On motion of Mr. Winder,

The house adjourned until tomorrow morning, ten o'clock.

## TUESDAY, January 19th, 1836.

The house met. Present the same members as on yester-

day. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The speaker laid before the House, a report from the register in Chancery, shewing the amount of seals and taxes accruing on proceedings in his office, and collectable by the sheriffs in the several counties in this State, for the past year.

Also, a report from the State Tobacco Inspector in war house No. 1,—relative to the several sums of money paid by him into the Western Shore Treasury, within the year
