Amendment proposed,

Add the following as an additional section to the bill;

"Section 7. And be it enacted, that nothing in this act contained shall be so construed as to confer any banking privileges on the company aforesaid, nor the right to issue any note in the nature of a Bank note,"

Which amendment was read the first and second time by

special order, and assented to;

The said bill was then read the first and second time by

special order.

Mr. Brookhart moved further to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof, as an additional section the follow-

ing:-

"Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That the stockholders of the said institution and their successors, shall at all times be bound in their individual capacity for all debts due, and demands of said corporation,"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. McMahon moved to amend said bill by adding at the

end threof as an additional section, the following:-

"Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That the said corporation shall report the situation of their concerns once in each year during the session of the General Assembly;"

Determined in the negative,

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass,

Resolved in the affirmative.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the clerk of Cecil county court, relative to the attendance of the judges.

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr Carter submitted the following order:--

By the House of Delegates, January 19th, 1836.

Ordered, that the petition of William W. Medford, of Caroline county, praying for a law to authorise him to remove into this State, from the State of Delaware, certain negroes therein mentioned, be withdrawn from the files of this House, and referred to a select committee of three, to be appointed by the chair.

Which was twice read and adopted;

In pursuance whereof, the speaker appointed Messrs.

Carter, Pratt, and Heard, to compose the committee.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day, the house proceeded to consider the order submitted Mr. Wharton, on the 15th inst. instructing the committee
