

The bill reported by Mr. Berry, entitled, an act to regulate Constables fees in Alleghany county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The Clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of William Adams, of Somerset county, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment," which amendment was read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the opening and extension of Currants alley in the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "will not pass."

And, delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, to Cumberland, and for the completion of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road to the Borough of York, in the State of Pennsylvania,

Which was read and referred to the Committee on ways and means.

Also, delivered a letter from John McKenney, Esquire, accepting of his appointment as a member of the Executive Council, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates;"

Which was read.

And the following message:

By the Senate,
January 18th, 1836.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We propose with the concurrence of your honourable body, the appointment of a joint committee of the House of Delegates and the Senate, for taking into consideration the expediency of providing fire proof offices, for the records and papers of the court of Chancery, and court of Appeals, and the executive departments.

We have appointed as a committee on the part of the Senate, Messrs. Mayer, Claude and Page, to join such committee as may be appointed on the part of your honorable body.
