Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Ely presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore and Anne Arundel counties, praying the passage of an act to regulate the Baltimore markets,

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Heard presented a petition of Milly Power, the widow of Jesse Power, a revolutionary soldier, praying to be placed on the pension roll,

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Long presented a petition of John S. Crockett, and Cadmus Dashiell, administrators of Matthias Dashiell, praying for the continuance of an act, which will expire during the present session of the legislature,

Which was read and referred to the committee on expiring laws.

And, Mr. Richardson presented a petition of Edward Slicer, of the state of Missouri, praying a special act of Insolvency,

Which was read and referred to the committee on Insolvency.

On motion of Mr. Matthews,

Ordered, that he have leave to withdraw from the files of the House, the petition of the heirs of Gen. John H. Stone, filed in the year 1813, and the papers therewith filed.

On motion of Mr. Carpenter,

Ordered, that the committee on pensions to indigent persons, by county assessment, enquire into the propriety of placing John Grooves, of Charles county, on the pension roll of said county.
