Which was read and referred to Messrs. Duvall, Annan, Willis, and Shriver.

Mr. Richardson presented a memorial of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying aichange in the present License system,

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways

and means.

Mr. Annan presented a petition of Sarah Hall, of Frederick county, praying to be divorced from her husband John H. Hall,

Which was read and referred to the committee on Di-vorces.

Mr. Worthington presented a petition of the Inpectors, Shippers, and Agents, for the sale of Tobacco, in the city of Baltimore, praying the erection of a new warehouse in said city,

Which was read and referred to the committee already

appointed on that subject.

Mr. Carpenter presented a report from the judges of the Orphan's court of Charles county, of the application made by them of the free school fund of said county,

Which was read and referred to the committee on Edu-

cation.

And, Mr. Wharton presented a petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying the repeal of the second section of the act passed December session 1825, chapter 223, relating to the manner of taking Supercedeas,

Which was read and referred to the committee on griev-

ances and courts of justice,

On motion of Mr. Heard, the house took up for consideration the order submitted by Mr. Dunkinson, instructing the committee on inspections to inquire into the expediency of constructing a tobacco warehouse in the city of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Heard, said order was amended by, striking out the words, "the committee on inspections," and inserting in lieu thereof, the following, "a select committee of five, to be appointed by the chair,"

The said order was then read the second time as amended,

and adopted,

In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messrs. Heard, Worthington, Kent, Brown and Iglehart, to compose the committee.

Mr. Jones obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to alter and amend the constitution and form of government, so as to require the assent of two thirds of each branch of the Legislature to annul a marriage contract,
