MONDAY, January 25th, 1836.

The house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

And, the resolutions in favor of Samuel Carey and John E. Carey; William B. Stephenson, and Captain John A. Webster, were sent to the Senate.

The Speaker laid before the House, a report from the clerk of Somerset county court, relative to the several sums of money paid by him into the Eastern Shore Treasury, within the year ending on the 30th of November,

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Also, a report from the trustees of Washington Academy, in Somerset county, relative to the condition of said Academy,

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Ely presented a report from the trustees of St. James's Academy, in Baltimore county, relative to the condition of said Academy,

And, Mr. Hardcastle presented a report of the Orphans'
