Also, the bill, entitled, an act for the relief of the old cit-

izens of Frederick city, in Frederick county,-

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to confirm an act, passed December session 1834, chapter 166, entitled, an act to alter and change a part of the civision line between the second, third and fourth election districts in Washington county,

And, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, passed December session 1833, chapter 144, entitled, an act for the re-assessment and re-valuation of all the real and personal property in Washington county, severally endorsed, "will pass," and severally ordered to be engrossed,

And, delivered a report from the Trustees of the Harford county Academy, relative to the condition of said Academy, endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the House

of Delegates,"

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

On motion of Mr. Boyd, the House took up for consideration, the unfavorable report submitted by Mr. Duckett, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, on the 22d inst. upon the petition of Zepheniah Bayless,

Mr. Boyd then offered a substitute for said report, a bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Zepheniah Bayless, of Har-

ford county,

Which was read.

Mr. Duckett moved that said report and substitute be laid upon the table,

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Winder, the House took up for consideration, the bill reported by Mr. Bayly, chairman of the committee on education, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act for incorporating the Govanstown Academy in Baltimore county,

On motion of Mr. Richardson, said bill was amended, by adding at the end of the fifth section thereof, the following, "so long as the said premises be used and occupied for

the purpose above described only,"

The said bill was then read the second time as amended,

and passed.
