100, was taken up for consideration, read the second time,

and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Merrick, chairman of the committee on ways and means, entitled, an act to incorporate the Atlantic Company of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration,

When, on motion of Mr. Ely, said bill was ordered to

lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Teackle, entitled, an act to provide for establishing an Agricultural School and Pattern Farm, in each of the counties of this State, was taken up for consideration,

When, on motion of Mr. Teackle, said bill was referred

to the committee on agriculture.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day, the house proceeded to consider the bill reported by Mr. Ely, entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction,

On motion of Mr. Spence, said bill was postponed, and made the order of the day for Tuesday next the 2d of Feb.

ruary.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Washington county, to appoint commissioners to review a certain road in said county, and for other purposes;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to provide for certain improvements and alterations in the court house in Washington county, severally endorsed, "will pass," ordered to be engrossed;
