Mr. Willis presented a memorial of the stockholders and directors of the Westminster Savings' Institution, praying

for an extension of the charter of said Institution,

And, Mr. Richardson presented a memorial of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore praying a change in the present License system,

Which were severally read and referred to the committee

on ways and means.

Mr. Ely presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, against a segregation of said county, and in favor of a separation of said county from the city of Baltitimore,

Which was read and referred to the committee already

appointed on that subject.

Mr. Brown presented a petition of Adam Dell, Robert Barnes, and others, citizens of Baltimore county, praying the passage of an act in regard to a certain road therein mentioned,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Brown, Carroll,

of Baltimore county, and Ely.

Mr. Kirby, of Kent, presented a petition of the Trustees of the Shrewsbury Academy, in Kent county, praying for a donation from the State,

Which was read and referred to the committee on educa-

tion.
