Which was read the first and second time by special order, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained, assented to.

Mr. Duckett submitted the following preamble and resolution:

Whereas there are sundry articles of furniture and other property in and about the government house belonging to the State, that are now useless and going to decay;—Therefore;

Resolved, That the Governor and Council be authorized and required to cause an examination to be made of the furniture and other property aforesaid, and to have all such articles sold at public auction, as they may deem unnecessary to be retained for public use, and that the proceeds arising from such sale be placed in the Treasury.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and assented to.

Mr. Travers reported a bill, entitled, an act to alter and change the name of Thomas Dawson, of Dorchester county, to the name of Thomas McKinzie;

Also, reported a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church, at Buckstown, in Dorchester county,

Which were severally read the first and second time by special order, and passed.

Mr. McLean reported a bill, entitled, an act for enlarging and extending Lexington Market, in the city of Baltimore,

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and the bill placed in the hands of the chair;

Mr. Winder moved to withdraw said bill from the hands of the chair,

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Ely, said bill was then laid on the table.
