On motion of Mr. Pratt, the house proceeded to ballot for a Speaker, pro tem.; the ballots of the members being collected in the ballot box, on examination thereof, it appeared that Nicholas Brewer, Esq, had received thirty four votes, that there were ten scattering, and four blank ballots,

Whereupon Nicholas Brewer, Esq., was declared duly elected the Speaker, pro tempore of the House of Delegates;

and accordingly took the chair.

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. McLean presented a memorial of the Trustees of St. Peter's Free School of the city of Baltimore, praying to be released from a State loan therein mentioned.

Mr. Travers presented a petition of sundry citizens of Fredericksburg, in Dorchester and Caroline counties, pray-

ing for an alteration in the present liceuse system.

Mr. Annan presented a petition of sundry citizens of Emmitsburg and its vicinity in Frederick county, praying an alteration in the present license system. And,

Mr. Beam presented a petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying the passage of a law, taxing travelling manageries, &c.
