Washington county, praying the passage of an act, calling a convention to revise the Constitution of this State,

And, Mr. Townsend presented a memorial of a large number of the voters of Cecil county, praying for a change in the present form of government and Constitution of this State,

Which memorials were severally read, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Nowland presented a petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying the establishment of a new-Election District, in said county,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Nowland, Town-

send and Henderson.

Mr. Boyd presented a petition of sundry citizens of Harford and Cecil counties, relative to the fisheries on the Potomac River,

Which was read and referred to the committee already

appointed on that subject.

Mr Brookhart presented a petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of an act to establish a place for holding the Elections in the eighth Election district in said county,

Which was read and referred to a select committee con-

sisting of Messrs Brookhart, Fiery, and Wharton.

Mr. Brookhart, asked to be excused from serving on said committee,

Resolved in the affirmative,

The Speaker then appinted Mr. Newcomer, on said committee, in place of Mr. Brookhart, who was excused by the house.

On motion of Mr. Travers,

Ordered, that a committee be appointed by the chair to enquire into the expediency of relinquishing, the dividends due to the State by the Nanticoke Bridge company, in aid of repairing the said Bridge;

In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messis.

Travers, Spence, and Teackle, the committee.

Mr. Bayly, chairman of the committee on Education, made a favourable report upon the resolution submitted by Mr. Travers on the 29th ultimo, authorising and requiring the treasurer of the Western Shore, to pay to the Trustees of the Vienna Academy, the sum of one hundred dollars, as a donation from the State,

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.
