On motion of Mr. Burchenal,

Ordered, that when this House adjourns, it shall stand adjoured, until tomorrow morning ten o'clock, which shall be the time for the meeting of this house, the remainder of the session unless otherwise ordered.

Mr. Dulany, submitted the following resolution,

By the House of Delegates. February 1st, 1836.

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the clerks of the county courts in the several counties of this State be, and they hereby are, required to sell at public auction, during their Spring terms, the Laws, and Journals of Proceedings of both houses of the Legislature which may have remained in their respective offices, uncalled for by the civil officers entitled to receive them, for a period of not less than one year; and to pay the proceeds of such sales to the justices of the Levy court, or the commissioners of the county, as the case may be, for the uses of their several counties respectively.

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the

table.

Mr. Ridgely, chairman of the committee on the militia, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, reported the same with the following amendments,

Amendments proposed,

Strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert the following; That the act entitled "an act to enroll, organize, equip, and regulate the militia of this State, passed December session 1834, chapter 251; be, and the same is hereby declared to be in full force and effect, for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore, with the exception of the several sections herein after to be repealed.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, that the provisions of this act nor of the act herein before recited, shall in no wise effect or operate upon the act, entitled, "an act for the establishment and regulation of the Baltimore City Guards," passed at the present session of the legislature of this

State.

Sec. 3 -And be it enacted, that the fifty third, sixtieth, and sixty first sections of the act, entitled, "an act to enroll, organize, equip, and regulate the militia of this State;" be, and the same are hereby repealed, so far as relates to or concerns the militia of the city of Baltimore.
