Ordered, that a select committee of three be and they are hereby appointed and instructed to enquire into the manner in which the loan of the State at the last session, for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, has been appropriated by said Company, and also to enquire into the causes which led to the false estimates of the cost of said work, and that said committee be authorized to send for persons and papers, and also to visit said work if they deem it necessary, and that they have power to sit during the approaching summer if they find that the investigation cannot be sufficiently prosecuted during the present session, and that they report their proceedings to the next General Assembly of Maryland.
