Constitution of the State of Maryland. And,

Mr. McMahon presented a memorial of sundry citizens of the seventh election district in Allegany county, praying for a reform of the Constitution of this State,

Mr. Richardson presented a memorial of William C. Harris, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be remunerated for damages sustained during the late riots in the city of Baltimore,

Which was read and referred to the joint committee ap-

pointed on that subject.

Mr. Gough presented a memorial of sunrdy citizens of Harford county, praying the curtailment of the seines on the Potomac river,

Which was read and referred to the com ittee already

appointed on that subject.

Mr. Winder presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying the passage of an act for the regulation of the Baitimore markets,

Which was read and referred to the committee already

appointed on that subject. And,

Mr. McLean presented a petition of John Gregg and others, heire and representatives of Thomas Gregg, late of the city of Baltimore, praying to be authorised to hold certain Real Estate therein mentioned,
