Also, the resolution for an examination of the furniture of the Government House, severally endorsed, "assented to," severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the resolution for the purchase of furniture for the Government House, endorsed, "dissented from," with the following message,

By the Senate,  
February 2nd, 1836.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received and rejected a resolution from your honorable body, authorising the Treasurer of the Western Shore to pay to his Excellency the Governor, \$1000, for the purpose of purchasing furniture for the Government House—the reason for so doing is the persuasion that the appropriation is wholly inadequate to furnish the Government House with supplies positively necessary for the comfort of those who may be called upon by the Legislature to occupy the building. As the resolution is not susceptible of an amendment from the Senate, should your honorable body upon the reconsideration of the subjects pass a resolution for a similar object containing an appropriation of three thousand dollars, it will meet with a favorable consideration of this body.
