So the resolution was assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. McLean, chairman of the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill, reported by Mr. Richardson, entitled, an act to incorporate the Band of United Brothers, of the State of Maryland, reported the same with the following amendments,

Amendments proposed.

In the 3rd line of the second section, strike out after members, the word "and," and in the same line strike out after the word corporate, the word "names," and insert the word "name."

In the 1st line of the 5th section, strike out the word assignments, and insert the word "appointments."

In the 6th section, strike out after the word, what power, on the 7th line, to the end of the section, and insert the following, "and all legal process that may be instituted against said corporation may be served upon the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, or either of the Stewards on behalf of the same."

After the 9th section, insert as an additional section the following,

"Section 10th. And be it enacted, That nothing in this act contained shall be so construed as to confer any banking privileges on the corporation aforesaid, nor the right to issue any note in the nature of a bank note."

Strike out section 11th.

And in the title of the bill strike out the words "of the State of Maryland," and insert "of the city of Baltimore,"

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table,
