Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the treasurer of the western shore, pay unto the commissioners for Anne Arundel county, the sum of two thousand eight hundred and twenty dollars and seventy fire cents, to be by them applied to defraying the expenses of arrest, prosecution and conviction of the rioters on the Baltimore and Washington Rail Road.

Which was read the first and second time by special order, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained, assented to, and sent to the senate,

On motion of Mr. Pratt,

Ordered, That five hundred copies of the report on the new map of Maryland, be printed for the use of this House,

On motion of Air. Teackle, the House took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act to provide for electing commissioners of Somerset county, and

prescribing their powers and duties,

On Motion of Mr. Teackle, said bill was amended, by inserting after the word "voters," in the first section, 19th line, the following, "one of which persons shall be bona fide resident of each of the election districts as originally established in the said county, and if two persons in the same district shall have received a greater number of votes than those voted for in any other district or districts, the highest only in each of the said districts shall be returned,

The said bill was then read the second time as amended,

and passed.

Mr. Annan, submitted the following preamble and resolution,

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Maryland, for the purpose of promoting the education of poor and orphan children, have granted an annual donation to "Saint John's Female Benevolent School and Orphan Asylum," as well as to "Saint John's Literary Institution," both in the city of Frederick; and whereas, the property, real and personal of the several county schools in this State, is exempted from taxation by virtue of the act of Assembly, passed on the 20th January, 1798—yet these literary and charitable institutions above named, not coming within the denominations of county schools in the said act mentioned, and being thus annually required to refund by taxation a considerable portion of the annual donation from the State-Therefore,
