SATURDAY, February 6th, 1836.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act for the relief of Elizabeth and Henry Fouke, of Washington county,

Also, the preamble and resolution relative to removing obstructions in the Susquehanna river, and to procure the co-operation of the States of New York and Pennsylvania, &c.,

Also, the resolution in favour, of the heirs of Thomas Goldsmith,

And, the resolution in favour of Mary Alexander, were sent to the Senate.

The bill from the Senate, entitled, a supplement to an act, relating to the records of conveyances in the several counties of this State, passed at December session 1833, chapter 88, rejected by the house on yesterday, was returned to the Senate.

Mr. Miller presented two memorials of sundry citizens of Kent county, severally praying an alteration of the license laws of this State,

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. McMahon, presented a petition of John J. Thomas, of the State of Kentucky, a revolutionary soldier, praying to be placed on the pension roll,

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Bryan presented a petition of Mary M. Lowe, of Prince George's county, praying to be placed on the pension roll of said county,
