Mr. McLean, chairman of the committee on corporations, reported a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Merchant's Fire Insurance company of Baltimore,

Also, reported a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Phoenix Fire Insurance company of Baltimore,

And, Mr. Carpenter, chairman of the committee on divorces, reported a bill, entitled, an act to divorce Mary Hammer, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband James J. Hammer,

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. McLean reported a bill, entitled, an act to authorise the city of Baltimore, to subscribe to the capital stock of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road company,

Which was read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Richardson reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to the act incorporating the Baltimore city Guards,

Which was read the first and second time by special order,

On motion of Mr. Ridgely, said bill was referred to the committee on the militia.

The bill reported by Mr. Richardson, entitled, an act to incorporate the Band of United Brothers, of the State of Maryland, and the amendments reported thereto from the committee on corporations, was taken up for consideration,

The amendments having been read the second time were assented to,

On motion of Mr. McLean, said bill was further amended, by striking out in the 11th section thereof, the word "ninety nine," and inserting in lieu thereof "sixty,"

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.
