By the House of Delegates.

February 6th, 1836.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have rejected your amendment to the resolution which passed this House on the 23d January last, allowing "all persons, who have been members of the Executive Council of the State, while at the seat of government—as free access to, and use of the library, established for the use of the legislature, as the members of the legislature, or of the Executive, or the Judges of the court of Appeals." We transmit to you said resolution, with the hope that you will pass it without amendment.
