

Mr. Lean, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, an act to condemn Caroline street from its present termination and to continue the same,

Ordered, that Messrs. McLean, Richardson, and Ely, report the same.

Mr. Merrick obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to establish by State authority, a State tobacco auction, in the city of Baltimore,

Ordered, That Messrs. Merrick, Worthington, and Weems, report the same.

Mr. Bryan obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to confirm and make valid the title of Horatio C. Scott, to a certain house and lot in the Town of Upper Marlbro,

Ordered, That Messrs. Bryan, Worthington, and Pratt, report the same.

Mr. Berry obtained leave to bring in a bill, to alter and change the constitution of this State, so as to elect in future the senate by the people, one from each county, and one from the city of Baltimore, likewise to elect the Governor by the people, to abolish the Executive Council, to give to Baltimore city two additional representatives, and to change the manner of appointing Registers of Wills, and county clerks of this state,

Ordered, That Messrs. Berry, Teackle, Kirby, of Kent, Townsend, Spence, Ely, and Hemsley report the same.

On motion of Mr. Richardson,

Ordered, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore of Maryland, report to this House, the statements of the several banks of this State in obedience to their respective charters.

On motion of Mr. Carpenter,

Ordered, That the committee on divorces, be enlarged by the appointment by the chair of two additional members until such time as the absent members of said committee shall return,

In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messrs. Lassell, and Mullikin, on the committee.

Mr. Teackle, submitted the following resolution,

By the House of Delegates,  
February 7, 1836.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William W. Stevens, and David Stevens, Executors of Levi. Stevens, or to their order twenty eight dollars and thirty three cents; being for eight months and fifteen days pension due to the said Levi at the time of his death, on the 15th day of Dec. 1834.
