

TUESDAY, February 9th, 1836.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday, with the exception of Messrs. Annan and Duvall, who had leave of absence. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act in favor of Charles Lee, a free man of color, in Frederick county,

And the resolutions relative to furnishing the judges of the Orphan's court of Harford county, with copies of the laws of this State, were sent to the Senate;

The bill from the senate, entitled, an act to change the name of Goodloe street in Baltimore,

And, the bill, entitled, an act for the better regulation of the militia of the city of Baltimore,

Were returned to the senate.

Mr. Merrick presented a memorial of Pearson Chapman, of Charles county, praying for a special act of Assembly, to make valid a certain devise,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Merrick, Dulaney, and Spalding,

Mr. Beam presented a petition of Maranda Hyatte, of Montgomery county, praying to be divorced from her husband Lloyd Hyatte,

Which was read and referred to the committee on Divorces.

Mr. McLean presented a memorial of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying that the corporate powers of the said city, be so enlarged, as to allow a new subscription to the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road stock,

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Matthews presented a petition of many citizens of election district No. 2, in Allegany county, praying an examination into, and a full report of the school fund of said county,

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Brown, presented a petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, asking a separation of the county from the city, and in opposition to the erection of new county,

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. McLean presented a memorial of Archibald Stirling, and others, praying that the mayor and city council of Baltimore, may be authorised to change the direction of Ais-
