Which was read the first and second time by special order, and concurred in.

Mr. Duckett, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Alexander Keer, of Baltimore county, praying a special act to make valid a certain Will therein mentioned,

Which was read the first and second time by special order.

On motion of Mr. Ely, said report was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ely submitted the following resolution,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the Treasurer of the Western shore pay to James Nelson, Esq. the sum of six dollars, for the use of Clemency Parrish, widow of Edward Parrish, deceased, late of Baltimore county, a soldier of the revolution, it being the amount due said Parrish for revolutionary services at the time of his decease,
