Which were severally read the first and second time by special order, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. McLean, chairman of the committee on corporations, to which was referred the bill reported by Mr. Ridgely, entitled, an act to incorporate the Elk Ridge Landing Lyceum, reported the same without amendment,

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Townsend reported a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act passed at December session, 1831, chapter 96, entitled, an act to authorise and empower the commissioners of Cecil county, to build a Bridge over the Big North East Creek, at or near William Phillips, in said county—and,

Mr. Hearn reported a bill, entitled, an act relating to constables fees, in Worcester county, and for other purposes,

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The Clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, an act to authorise and empower the Levy court of Frederick county, to cause an alphabetical record entry to be made of all the original Land certificates in said county, now in the Surveyor's office, endorsed, "will pass," ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to divorce William Ford, of Montgomery county, from his wife, Azenia Ford, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first and second time by special order, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill, entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of the town of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, to remove certain obstructions from the mouth of Cambridge creek, endorsed, "will not pass;"

Also, the resolution in favor of Nicholas D. Coleman, attorney in fact for the heirs of Joshua Burgess; endorsed, "assented to," ordered to be engrossed;
